WOF referee rules

General rules in all styles

1. The rules of Ring:

A) Ring platform & Competition Ring

The oriental ring means all area inside the four the square posts.

Ring platform raised not less than 90 centimeter (3 foot) and it is not more than 122 centimeter above the ground.

- 1-small size 6.40 * 6.40 square meter
- 2- Large size 7*7 square meter

1.1. The Competition Ring:

Competition ring means all of the square space inside the ropes, and it has tow sizes:

- 1-Small size 5.5*5.5 square meter
- 2-Large size 6.10*6.10 square meter

For international competitions, the large size ring shall be used. It is permissible to use two rings, if there are many competitors and using only one ring would cause many problems in arranging the competition.

1.2. The ring floor:

The ring floor shall be soundly constructed with no obstruction and extend 92 centimeter (3 foot) beyond the ropes each side.

1.3. The ring corners:

All of the four corners shall have a post , that covered neatly with foam or in whatever manner would cause no danger for the competitors. The ring corners shall be arranged as follows:

The red corners: it is the left side near to the chairman of judges (Jury).

The blue corners: it is opposite of the red corner.

The two other corners are white.

1.4. The ring floor material:

The ring floor shall be laid on either felt, plastic or other flexible materials, it's thickness shall be at least 2.54 centimeter (1 inch) but not more than 5 centimeter (2 inches), all covered with canvas stretched tightly.

1.5. The Ropes:

There are 4 ropes, at least 3 centimeters thickness, but not more than 5 centimeters that stretched tightly to the four ring corner posts. they shall be positioned 40, 80.120 and 150 centimeter, respectively above the ring floor. The ropes at each side of the ring shall be held rigid by 2 pieces of strong cloth, equally spread, so the rope spacing shall not vary during the contest.

1.6. Steps:

There shall be 3 sets of steps in ring: two sets of steps at each of red corner and blue corner, provided for the competitor and their second. The third set of steps is provided at a neutral corner, near the time keeper, for the use of the doctor and for health.

1.7. Ring Equipments:

The ring equipments shall be as follow:

1-7-1 each red & blue corner should be provided by 3 seats for the fighters during fighting.

2-7-1 Round seats for the fighters to rest on between rounds.

3-7-1 two bottles of water, 2water buckets with 2plastic cups or bottle.

4-7-1 tables and chairs for the official –in –charge.

5-7-1 the **WOF** score papers for giving advantage.

6-7-1 a bell

7-7-1 two stopwatches

8-7-1 A microphone, amplifier and loud speaker equipments.

9-7-1 A first aid kit

10-7-1 a stretcher

11-7-1 ten counter advantage.

B) Tatami

Tatami is a compact sponge square that is from compact in size (12*12), that the fighters compete in (8*8) size, moreover 2 extension meters in around that is in order to safety fighters.

1- Competition ground: the ground should be smooth and without danger and shouldn't be slippery.

2- The distance of ever fighter from Tatami center is 1 meter that separate by blue and red lines.

3- The distance of referee from Tatami center is 1 meter.

4- Help referees should be located on the chair in tow sides of the Tatami.

5- There is a table with 3 chairs, out of the Tatami and opposite of the mid referee, that is the seat of main referee and time keeper and advantage writer. The main referee located in mid.

6- There is tow chairs in left side and right side for trainers of tow fighter.

2. Dress and safety equipments:

1.2. Dress

The Fighters who entering competition shall be dressed accordance to the following:

Each fighter should wear red short/pants or blue short /pants, according to his/her corner. Its band should be red or blue that moreover country name and country flag of the fighters, such short shall be allowed to bear the name or logo of his supporter, not larger than 10 centimeter in size.

2.2. Fighter safety equipments:

The safety equipments should not be old .the toenails shall be cut short. Elasticized supporter shall be worn on both ankles throughout the fight .it is prohibited to use them on the shins or knees, and the bandage should not be used instead of elasticized. Don't use from any oil and dangers materials in your body. If a referee understands such material is used, he/she must clean it.

3.2. Gloves:

There are 2 kind gloves in Oriental:

- Boxing Gloves

1.3.2 – the fighter's with less than 67 kilogram weight should wear 284 gram Gloves. (10 ounces).

2.3.2 – the fighter's with more than 67 kilogram weight should wear 340 gram Gloves. (12 ounces).

3.3.2 -the details of hand bandage: a suitable bandage is a soft and light weight bandage, it is not more than 2.50 meters and 5 centimeters spread That is used to wrap each hand.

- Grappling Gloves

1.3.2 – the fighter's with less than 67 kilogram weight should wear Gloves. (10 ounces).

2.3.2 – the fighter's with more than 67 kilogram weight should Gloves. (12 ounces).

4.3.2. gum shield:

Competitor shall wear gum shields that fit their gum shield.

5.3.2. Head shield:

Competitor shall wear head shield, as the order of official committee in charge.

6.3.2. Shin shield:

Competitors shall wear shin shield and foot shield as the order of official committee in charge.

7.3.2. Groin shield (for male) and breast shield (for female):

Competitors shall wear a groin shield or breast shield of strong material.

3. Medical Examination & Weighting for international Competition:

1.3 medical examinations:

1.1.3. At the time fixed for weighing-in, competitors shall undergo a medical examination by a **WOF** appointed doctor to certify that they are healthy before being weighed in... .The **WOF** Executive committee may arrange for the medical examination to be made before the time of weighing-in, so that the weighing-in will run slowly.

2.1.3. For weighing-in and medical examination the fighters shall submit to the responsible official his personal record of international competition signed by the Secretary General or Chairman of his National Association, in order to complete the necessary details. If any competitor does not submit his personal record during the medical examination and weighing-in, he will not be permitted submit his personal record during the medical examination and weighing-in, he will not be permitted to committee.

3.3. Weigh-in:

1.3.3. For world championships, Continental championships and international championships, the following rules shall apply weighing-in:

2.3.3. Competitors in all divisions must be ready to be weighed at the night before the competition at the time arranged between 06.00 P.M until 9.00 P.M.

The **WOF** executive committee or it's representatives have the authority to extend the weigh-in period in case of some unforeseen circumstances causing delay. The competition shall not start earlier than 6 hours after weighing-in.

If the competitions are going to commence the competition earlier than 6 hours after the last weighing-in, so the **WOF** executive committee must obtain the consent of the medical Team in order to ensure that the competition will not harm the fighters in the initial matches.

3.3.3. The weight-in officials should determine by the **WOF**, from the National Representatives. A representative of association, that entered the contestant into the competition, will be allowed to observe the weight-in .but he/she must not do anything to interrupt it.

4.3.3. At the weight-in day, fighter is allowed to weight-in by official scale just one time. The weight measurement on the official scale is considered to be the final weigh. However, the representative of the team whose competitors cannot weight their division range the first time will be allowed to transfer him a higher or lower division suitable to his weight, if there is no other competitor from his team in that division, and the weight-in period is not yet ended.

5.3.3. The weight measurement shown on the scale must be legible to the naked eye, and be in metric units. It is permissible to use a digital scale.

6.3.3. The weight recorded should be without clothes.

7.3.3. The International competitions:

1.7.3.3. About the competitions between two or more countries, the weigh-in officials shall be appointed by the federation of the nation which promote the competition, and a representative from the competing nations or the representatives from other nations shall be invited to be assistants. These National Representative shall have the right to check the weight of each contestant.

2.7.3.3. In international Competitions or world Competitions, the weighing – in of the fighters may be take time 3 ours. Any fighters who weighs over his/her division or who does not appear within the arranged time for weight-in will be declared the lose.

3.7.3.3. The association of the host country shall provide the weigh- in scale and provide a place for training in accordance to the requirements of the teams, when the teams arrive at the City in which the competition is to be promoted.

4. Coaches:

Each competitor is entitled to have 2 coaches who shall observe the following rules:

1.4. Competitor could have only 2 coaches on the ring, and only one of them could enter the roped area.

2.4. During rounds, the coaches are not allowed to remain on the ring. Before each round, the coaches must pick up the required things such as towel, and bucket from the ring edges.

3.4. the coaches to perform his duties at the corner, he/she must have a towel and a sponge for his/her fighter If he realize that his fighters cannot continue the fight, he may surrender on his behalf by throwing the towel or sponge into the ring, expect whilst the referee is process of counting.

4.4. The chairman of the referee and judges committee of each competition shall call a meeting of referees, judges and seconds involve, in the competition to emphasize that the **WOF** rules have to be followed strictly and any fighters who break these rules may be penalizing not merely by point dedications but also by disqualification.

5.4. The coaches are forbidden to advice assists or encourage their fighters during the course of the contest. If any coach violated this rule, he will be warned or dismissed from his duties; his fighters may also be cautioned, warned or disqualified by the referee because of the misbehavior of his coach.

Any coach or official encouraging or inciting spectators by words or gesture to advise or encourage a fighters during around shall be suspended from his function as coach or official for the remainder of the competition .if the referee from his duties suspend the coach, he shall not perform them for the remainder of the contest concerned .when the referee orders his suspension from such duties, he must leave the arena for the remainder of the contest concerned. If, between the first and last days of the tournament, a coach is twice disqualified from his duties, he shall be forbidden to ever act as a coach again.

5. The jury:

1.5. Appointment:

In the world and international championship competitions, the **WOF** executive Committee shall appoint the members of the Jury for each competition.

The jury shall comprise not less than 3, but not more than 5 persons, including the chairman of the judge. Two member of the jury shall be a referee and a judge. During the course of a competition, those not on a jury shall not be permitted to sit in the jury's seats. The schedule for jury service shall be circulated for the different perms and arrangements completed before the competition starts, by the president o f the **WOF** or in the absence of the president. By his representative.

Any member of the jury who wishes to change the schedule shall obtain the consent of the president in representative beforehand.

Members of the **WOF** committee who are who are on the list of international referee / judges , and the member of referees and judges committee , together comprise the jury and have the right to vote.

2.5. The jury's duties:

1.2.5. Each member of the jury shall award scores to each pair of contestant; his scores shall be compared with those of the other members of the jury.

2.2.5 The member of the jury shall check the score sheets of the 5 judges, in order to ensure that:

- The addition of score is correct.
- The names of the competitors are correct.
- The name of the winner is correct.

3.2.5. The completed score sheets shall be signed, and the decision of the score sheet, or the computer, or the score recording machine, checked.the chairman of the referee and judges or the person who acts as the

representative of the jury shall inform the announcer of the name of the winner, in accordance with the majority of the five score sheets, in order to announce it to the spectators.

4.2.5 The jury officiating in each period shall meet in the morning, of the following day to evaluate the work done by the referee and the judge didn't perform his duty correctly or not up to standard, he shall be report to the **WOF** executive committee the jury shall require that referee or judge to reconsider the pervious days decision.

5.2.5. The jury shall give a written report to **WOF** executive committee if the referee or judge did not perform his duties in accordance with the **WOF** rules or if any judge did not correctly award the scores.

6.2.5. The jury must submit the document to the **WOF** executive committee for it to be forwarded to the referee s and judges committee is necessary. The jury shall inform the **WOF** executive committee if any international referee or judge , who has been appointed by his association and is selected to officiate at an international competition , or at world or continental championship , has absented himself from duty without informing the **WOF** secretary general before hand and with out responsible explanation.

7.2.5. If any official appointed does not appear, the jury may appoint a suitable official from those qualified to replace him, reporting the change to the chair man of the referee s and judges committee as soon as possible.

8.2.5. In event of any disruption preventing the referee performing his duty at a competition, the jury may stop the competition until the situation is back to normal.

9.2.5. The jury or those actions as a jury may take immediate action when they think it is necessary due to some incident likely to cause an obstacle to the competition at any period.

10.2.5. The members of the jury shall consult the referee and the judges on any matter necessary before making any decision.

11.2.5. If any contestant intentionally commits any / unsporting misconduct, the jury is empowered to refer such misconduct to the **WOF**. Executive committee for it to announce that he is deprived of his right to compete for a certain period of time. The **WOF** executive committee may also deprive that contestant from receiving any aware was entitled to win in that contest.

12.2.5. Power to overrule the referee and / or judge. The jury in the following cases may overrule the decision of the referee and / or judge:

13.2.5. When the referee s decision clearly violated the **WOF**. Or the rules (in such a circumstance, the jury may use the video tape in support).

14.2.5. When it is clear that several judges made mistakes in their score sheets resulting in the wrong decision.

6. Referees

6.1 Appointment of international Referee. The position of an international referee / judge is a most honorable post. A person who is in the international list will receive upper-grade certificate as an international referee / judge, and will receive **WOF**. Insignia appreciate to the appointment as well as an accreditation card.

6.1.1 For been occupied on the list of **WOF** Referees / judge, a person must have been proposed by his national association with medical certification that he is fit and healthy enough to perform such duties.

6.1.2 He shall not be over 55 years old, and shall complete the **WOF**. Referee/judges training courses satisfactorily. The amateur **WOF** shall check and update the list of referees / judges to make sure that its referees / judges can perform their duties efficiently.

6.2. to dress up: The referee shall wear a black coat and black trousers with world federation logo, world federation badge logo, black shirt with world federation logo in back and on the left pocket, black lightweight shoes, and wear a yellow bow tie with world federation logo; If the weather is too warm, he could excused wearing the bow tie, if the chairman of the jury or the chairman of the referee and judges committee be agree.

6.3 The duties of a referee.

6.3.1 In an international championship Competition, the accredited referee by the **WOF**, shall performs the duty of officiating in the ring, but not award points.

6.3.2 The first reefers 's worry is to take care of the fighters. When officiating in the ring, the referee should:

6.3.2.1 Make sure that the rules and justice exactly observed.

6.3.2.2 to control the throughout competition.

6.3.2.3 to Prevent a weaker fighters receiving under and unnecessary punishment.

6.3.2.4 Check the fighters' s gloves and dresses.

6.3.2.5 Use tease three words in order to command:

Ist: When the referee order to the fighters that they stop fighting.

Sharo: When the referee order to the fighters that they continue fighting.

Joda: When the referee want to divide 2 fighters from the other without stopping the fight, and just at the mid of ring, he use this word.

Sharo usually use inside the ropes after **Ist** word.

6.3.2.6 The referee, Indicate to the fighters any infringement of the rules by suitable explanatory signs or gesture.

6.3.2.7 The referee Collect and check the score papers of the 5 judges, at the end of fight; before referring the results to the chairman of the jury.

6.3.2.8. Dos not indicate the winner by raising the fighter's hand or any other announced. After the announcement has been made, the referee shall raise the winner's hand

6.3. 2. 9. Inform the chairman of the jury when he understands the fighter to have lost the competition or give them his reasons for stopping the fight, so the chairman of the jury may be advise the announcer that he informs the specters correctly .

6.4 The referee's powers

6.4.1 The referee is able to stop the fight, after noticing that one fighter is better than his opponent.

8.4.2 The referee is able to stop the fight, after noticing that one fighter is too injured that dos not able to continue the fighting.

6.4.3 The referee is able to stop the fight, after noticing that contestants are not fighting seriously; in such cases, one of the contestants will be ordered to leave the competition.

6.4.4 The referee is able to warn the fighters or stop the fight in order to deduct points from the contestant who commits a infringement or for other reasons, so justice will be achieved or procedure maintained in accordance with the rules.

6.4.5 The referee is able to order the contestant who does not follow orders immediately or who attacks or abuses from the referee to leave the competition.

6.4.6 The referee is able to order the coach who infringes the rules to leave his duties and to order the contestant to leave the competition if his coach does not follow the order of the referee.

6.4.7 The referee is able to order the fighter who committing infringement to leave the competition, whether a warning has been given or not. But, it depends on infringement kind & condition.

6.5. Warning: The referee may be warning to the fighter. Warning is an advice that gives to the fighter in order to prevent of infringements that is not serious enough to merit disqualification. The referee use from any suitable chance that without stopping the fight, to warn.

6.6 Caution. The referee may caution fighters. if a fighter have 3 times infringement, but tease are not enough serious for disqualified, the referee should stop the fight for warning & deducting score. the referee shall signal with his hand to the judges that warning has been given and indicate clearly the fighters he has warned . After giving such a warning, the Referee shall command to the fighters to fight on. If a fighters is given three warning in one contest he shall be disqualified.

6.7 Medical examination of referee. Before officiating in any international tournament conducted under these rules, a referee shall undergo a medical examination to determine whether he is healthy and fit enough to carry out his duties in the ring. His eyesight shall be not less than six diapers. While officiating in the ring, the referee is prohibited from wearing spectacles, but may use contact lenses. Before each contest, the referee must attend a meeting arranged by the medical committee. If the referee is unable to continue the performance of his duty in the course of the contest, the timekeeper shall ring the bell to stop the fight, and the next referee on the per- arranged duty list for officiating in the competition ring shall continue the contest.

7. Judges

7.1 number of judges. In each competition there shall be 5 judges, 3 may be used instead of, but not for an international competition.

The judge shall be seated separately from the spectators and close to the ring. Two judges shall be seated at one side of the ring and at a suitable distance. One of the other three judges will be designated seats until the result has been announced to the spectators.

7.2 dress. Adjudge shall wear black trousers, a white short – sleeved shirt with a black bow tie and papion for referees.

7.3. The duties of judge.

7.3.1 Each judge shall independently assess the fighting abilities of the 2 fighters and shall decide the winner according to the rules.

7.3.2. A judge shall not speak to any fighter; or to any one except the referee whilst the contest is in progress. He may be, if necessary, during the rest intervals bring to the notice of the referee any incident that had occurred which may have escaped the notice of the referee, such as misconduct by a second, loose ropes, etc.

7.3.3. A judge shall enter the points awarded to both fighters on his score paper immediately after the end of each round, if computerized scoring is not being used.

7.3.4. At the end of the bout, if computerized scoring is not being used, each judge will total up the points with the help of a mechanical counter, nominate a winner, and sign his score paper. The decision of the judges has to be checked by the chairman of the referees and judges Committee, and be announced by master of ceremonies, or an announcer, to the spectators.

- 7.3.5. If using a computer, the judge will enter the scores by pressing the red or blue button as soon as a fighter actually hits the target without his opponent blocking the attack or defending himself.

8. Timekeeper:

8.1. The duties of the Timekeeper.

8.1.1. The main duty of the time keeper is to regulate the number and duration of the rounds and intervals between rounds. The intervals between rounds shall be of one full minute's duration.

8.1.2. Five seconds before the commencement of each round, the time keeper shall ensure that the ring is clear by signaling the second to leave the ring is clear by signaling the seconds to leave the ring , by ringing the bell, whistling etc. or by Giving the following orders "out of the ring" seconds out".

8.1.3. The time keeper shall given the signal to commence and each round by striking the gong or bell.

8.1.4. The timekeeper shall give the signal to commence and each round by striking the gong or bell

8.1.5 The timekeeper shall deduct time for temporary stoppages, or following the referees order to stop.

8.1.6 The timekeeper shall regulate all periods of time including the counts by a pocket watch or clock.

8.1.7 At the fighters knock down; the timekeeper shall signal to the Referee with his hand the passage of the seconds as the referee ids counting.

8.1.8 At the end of any round, if a fighters is "down" and the referee is counting, when the two-minute duration of the round ends, the bell shall not be rung until the Referee commands Fight. In the event of the last round of the World Championship, a Continental or International competition, the Timekeeper shall ring the bell at the end of the two-minute round even though the referee is counting.

8.1.9 The time keeper shall sit down near the ring.
